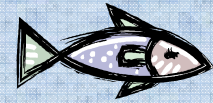

Communication via computer is more than just e-mail. In particular, there are two technologies that have revolutionized the way people keep in touch. If you want to be better informed about what's happening among your friends and family, you may consider using one or both of the following.



Social networking web sites. Social networking web sites such as Facebook.com allow you to create a virtual network based on the social connections you have in real life. Once you establish online "friendships" with other users, you can send and receive automatic updates whenever either party's information changes. For example, you can receive automatic notification when a friend uploads new photos or changes their contact information. This can be good way to keep abreast of what's happening with friends and family you don't see often. Facebook.com appears to have particular appeal over other sites to non-computer-savvy adults.

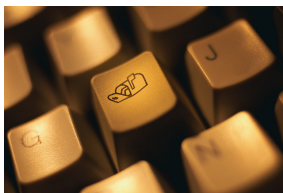
Service Spotlight: 2009 Calendar
